





Shadow Eyes is the initial story in a series focused on Iris and her abilities to see and interact in the world around her. The plot is strong and character development and emotions are right on point. I did find myself frustrated from time to time wondering what happened on Iris's fourteenth birthday, but this was finally revealed at the end of the story.

Dusty Crabtree does an excellent job of bringing in the reader to the center of the story. The various plot twists and foreshadowing cause the reader to consider and then reconsider what is happening within the story and Iris's life. While the main story focuses on Iris, the secondary characters including Iris's close friends and family members each have a strong backstory that is integral to the overall plot in which Iris the focus.

The editing is clean, and the story flows nice without being too descriptive or wordy. Everything that occurs or is described has a place within the story. Aside from the frustration of being left in the dark with events surrounding the fourteenth birthday, this was a nearly perfect read!

Author Interview Q&A

Q: Where did you get the idea of the Shadows?

A: The idea actually first came to me as a screenplay for a Christian horror movie of some sort. The movie would have been about a cast of intertwined characters going about their lives and making mistakes with dark, creepy shadows (demons) hovering around them, whispering to them, and influencing them to do evil things. Only the audience would see the shadows. The characters would be completely oblivious. I simply tweaked that idea until I had something workable for a more secular YA book - a 17-year-old girl who had this special ability to see the shadows and light figures when nobody else could.

Q: How much of yourself or from personal experience have you put into the characters? D: Oh, bits and pieces here and there. Iris has a few of my characteristics – being a perfectionist and an organizational freak mainly...I'm not kidding, sometimes I seriously think I have OCD. The funny bit about Iris's sister waking up and showering in the middle of the night actually came from my sister who used to do the same thing! I also went on a spelunking trip with my Advanced Earth Science class and a goofy teacher who didn't know what he was doing, just like Mr. Keller. However, the thing with the boy in the cave...sadly, that didn't happen to me.

Q: What authors have been an inspiration to you in your own writing?

A: Some of my favs are Suzanne Collins for her coming up with such an incredible story and trilogy, Becca Fitzpatrick for the great flow she has in her writing, and Neal Shusterman for his uncanny ability to create a unique voice for ALL of his characters, even the minor, minor ones, as well as the poignant and powerful aspect of his writing.

Q: Did you always want to be an author?

A: Actually, the thought never really crossed my mind. Although I wrote a few things when I was younger, there was a major dry spell from high school on until I got the idea for Shadow Eyes. I must have had the creative writer gene lurking around inside me for a while, though, because it didn't take long for me to realize my passion for writing. As I've continued through my fourth book now, I love the craft even more. The only problem I have is trying to balance my love of writing with my other passion and "real job" of being a teacher...which, obviously, takes up a lot of my time.

Character Interview Q&A with Patrick (love interest)

Q: So, Patrick, why do you think Dusty Crabtree chose you for this interview?

A: Well, don't tell anyone, but I think she has a small crush on me. It's embarrassing, really. I can't say that I blame her, though. It's her fault anyway for making me so smooth and desirable.

Q: What do you like most about Iris?

A: Well, I would say "everything," but I'm assuming that's too corny and cliché and that you're looking for a more specific answer, so...let me try again. I love her innocence and

naivety. There's just something so sweet about that quality in her. It kind of melts me heart, to be honest. But if anyone asks, I didn't say that.

Q: What do you like least about Iris?

A: I know this will sound weird, but the same quality I love, kind of gets annoying too. Sometimes I wish she would just open up her eyes and see what's truly going on around her. It would make my life a whole lot easier. Well, more difficult at first probably, but in the end, a lot easier.

Q: What, if anything, would you like to change about your life?

A: A decision I made about a year ago. It was probably the worst decision of my life, and now I'm paying for it.

Q: What is your biggest fear?

A: That Iris will find out my secret. But also, that she won't.
